## **Focus on Learning:**

As we end January learning is in full effect. Today students in third grade presented their informational, non-fiction writing with our younger students and families. Next week they will begin working on persuasive writing. So... if your student starts lobbying for something at home, and they have gotten much better at it, you can blame us at school!

Coming up this month our First grade students will be working on their 100<sup>th</sup> Day projects. This fun yearly project combines math with a celebration of learning so far this year. It is always a highlight of my school year.

In fifth grade the students are working hard learning the ins and outs of fractions. Ask them about how to find common denominators.

Kindergarteners continue to blossom as with their emerging storybooks. Work with them using their reading superpowers. Ask them questions about the stories you read with them. These questions can include looking at the pictures and asking them to predict what will happen or how they think the character feels.
