Class assignments for next year 2017-18:

This year we are working to streamline and further improve our class assignments and groupings for next school year. Please understand we put a lot of time, consideration, and weigh a lot of factors into this process. We do allow for some guardian requests for classroom placement. We ask that you make these requests in writing and state an educational reason for the request. Please also understand that we try to accommodate these requests, but do not guarantee the requested placement. Because we are starting our process early this year, we are asking that any such **requests must be made by Wednesday April 12, 2017.** Any requests made after that will not be considered. We do this because once we begin the process, changing placements drastically impacts our groupings and our ability to provide supports to students.
